#### Message from Michael Shukwit, Director of Operations

Dear Families and Friends of Elmwood.

I am the Cemetery's new Director of Operations. I have been with Elmwood since 2001 and have 15 years of experience in the cemetery business. Prior to coming to Elmwood, I was superintendent of another Detroit area cemetery. I am responsible for managing the outside operations and purchasing. Also, I oversee capital improvements at the Cemetery, such as our restoration of the Chapel, the pond, and the next phase of the road. The Cemetery trustees and I believe preventive maintenance forestalls major problems and I manage the cemetery accordingly. The work we are able to do is made possible through your donations to the Historic Elmwood Foundation and the trustees' astute management of our endowment fund.

We are very fortunate to have an outstanding staff of dedicated grounds men at Elmwood. I wanted to take this opportunity to highlight some of the improvements we have made this year to the Cemetery buildings and grounds.

Mausoleum. As you can see from the pictures the old mausoleum's roof needed to be replaced. We chose a modified cap roof.





Arboretum. We had to remove 9 trees due to disease and damage. We developed a reforestation plan and planted 26 trees with the help of your donations and grants received. These new trees can be seen near the gatehouse, along the fence line across from section A and in front of the historic Chapel.





Flowers and Gardens. This spring we enjoyed the beauty of the 300 daffodil bulbs planted on the hill and the 200 scilla bulbs planted under our beautiful beach trees. In addition, the crew planted vinca around the 115 sign posts throughout the property. Perennial lilies were split and relocated along the eastern fence line. A new thirty foot bed was installed in ornamental ground between two of the reflection benches down the road from the new mausoleum. This bed is comprised of native Michigan grasses and perennials. As it matures, we will split the plants and develop beds in other areas.



**Pond Hillside.** The hillside across the road from the pond was very overgrown. We cleaned out the debris, leaving the trees and ground cover in place, and now have a view of the pond from section A. This careful cleaning returned the area to its original design. We will plant 500 daffodil bulbs in this area later this fall.

**Retaining Wall.** There is a 3½ foot tall retaining wall that runs along section A at the roadway. The wall, installed many decades ago, was crumbling and needed to be replaced. The new wall is under construction as this newsletter goes to print. It is in keeping with the style of the traditional stone used at the Cemetery.

Roads. The first phase of our road restructuring program was completed in 2007. This year we seal-coated the area to further protect it and extend its life.

Chapel. The walkway into and around the chapel had become dangerous due to cracking and settling from our cold Michigan winters and we therefore replaced it. We also transplanted two Japanese maple trees from in front of the chapel to section B. These trees had grown too large for the Chapel area. We have placed weeping cherry trees and relandscaped in front of the chapel entry. All the former landscaping was utilized elsewhere on the grounds.



Memorial Cleaning. This is a new service available through Elmwood. The dramatic difference is best illustrated in the photos below of the Ford family monument.




# Message from Terry Peck Book, Chairwoman of the Historic Elmwood Foundation



# Restoring Elmwood Cemetery with careful management and ambitious vision

Restoration of Elmwood Cemetery

WITH THE TURN OF THIS CENTURY, the Trustees of Elmwood Cemetery determined the entire infrastructure of the Cemetery needed to be restored and made manageable for the long term. The initial step was the completion of a physical master plan for the entire Cemetery.

The first major project was the restoration of the Gatehouse. This project retained the historic structure and image while creating a state-of-the-art Administrative Center with a quality customer service environment, and a secure record retention facility.

To assist in the Cemetery's restoration and, as an outreach vehicle to make Elmwood a community destination, the Trustees formed the Historic Elmwood Foundation in 2005. This entity, a 501(c)(3) corporation, complements the not-for-profit cemetery corporation.

Some of the initial steps to make Elmwood more beautiful include annual and perennial plantings, tree reforestation, monument restoration, benches for visitors and a transportation vehicle for the disabled. Through the Foundation, the Historic Elmwood Chapel has been preserved and restored. With Cemetery funds, the Trustees updated and repaired the Cemetery's Maintenance Center, improved signage and implemented the initial phase of the roadway reconstruction. In its

permanent road system, Elmwood has just over five miles of roadway. The total roadway project is a \$1.2 million capital improvement, of which the initial phase consumed the first \$180,000 of this cost and was completed in 2007. In addition to the increased safety inherent with new roads, project completion, which also includes adding curbs, will enable better maintenance of the grass and roads and help prevent water and soil runoff. Section and lawn renovations can begin once the roads are completed. These significant steps complement our other projects.

The lawn renovations tie into the pond restoration. "Bloody Run Creek", so named following the battle between the British and Chief Pontiac in 1763, feeds our pond as do the runoff and storm sewers in the Cemetery. We hope to dredge the pond, increasing its capacity and enabling it to be a source of partial irrigation for the Cemetery grounds. In addition, we will enhance the pond with a sculpture, fountain, and flowers. The Pond Civil and Environmental Engineering Study is a project we hope to begin in 2008.

We have received grants for two small reforestation projects and plan to apply for others. We are pursuing grant opportunities for audio tours including maps and signage, tree identification and signage, Chapel tuck-pointing and repair and restoration of important monuments on our grounds. Administratively, we want to continue our records automation program and the imaging to preserve historic files and family profiles.

All of these projects need to be accomplished while our investment advisors strive to grow our Endowment Fund to twice its current principal amount over the next decade. With careful management of our operating income and expenses and with the help of the Friends of Elmwood, this ambitious vision can be fully implemented before 2018.



# **Elmwood Cemetery Tours**


Regular guided are led by retired Cemetery Director Mr. Chancey Miller who regales tour participants with the interesting stories of those laid to rest at Elmwood. Typically, our tours are held in all weather and are walking tours. We do have a small transportation vehicle to assist the elderly or disabled. This must be arranged in advance.

Bus tours of forty individuals or less can also be accommodated. Advance reservations are required for all tours. Please contact the office staff to arrange your tour.

Members of the Historic Elmwood Foundation receive free tour admission depending upon their level of donation. Non-members incur a charge of \$5 per person for regular tours. Group tours are \$50 for 10-20 people and \$100 for more than 20 people. Special tours are priced separately. Proceeds from all tours are given to the Historic Elmwood Foundation.
