



Fall Guided Tour Schedule

Established in 1846, Elmwood Cemetery contains the graves of many prominent men and women including civil war generals, 7 governors, 11 U.S. senators, 30 Detroit mayors, and countless business and community leaders. Come join us on a guided walking tour as we share the stories of Detroit and the people that helped shape our great city and contributed to advancement for our citizens and industry. FALL TREE TOUR

Join us as we pair a bit of history with learning about Elmwood's different trees from a certified arborist. The arborist will share how to identify different species explaining varying bark and leaf design, as well as flowers and buds. He will also discuss disease prevention and tolerance.

Tours are also available through our partners – Detroit Historical Society, Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History, and Preservation Detroit.



Do you prefer touring on your own?

Elmwood has developed self-guided tours for your convenience. These educational tools are designed to permit visitors to walk along our pathways at their own pace and learn some of the history of our grounds and those laid to rest at Elmwood Cemetery. The self-guided maps are available, free of charge, in our office, along with other educational material, or may be downloaded from Elmwood's website, www.elmwoodhistoriccemetery.org.

The history tours highlight three unique categories: African American Heritage, Business Visionaries, and Political Leaders. You may follow a map on your own or we recommend you use the accompanying audio version of the tour downloadable through our website, www.elmwoodhistoriccemetery.org.

We also developed three separate tree maps that highlight the varying species of trees across our 86 acres. The trees on the maps each have a tree identification marker that notes the scientific and common names, and a QR code. If you have a smart phone you can use this code to find out more facts about a particular species.





2018 Special Event Wrap Up

We enjoyed a variety of different activities held this spring and summer at Elmwood.

ARBOR DAY

14 children from an area elementary school's 4th grade class celebrated at Elmwood this year. They learned about the history of Arbor Day, Elmwood's arboretum, and the importance of trees to the environment and the US economy. They planted a Hedge Maple tree in section E and then toured the cemetery grounds. The students researched many remarkable people and then gave presentations at many gravesites.

BIRDING

Regular birding walks with Detroit Audubon have been exciting. Elmwood is home to many species and during spring migration season we witnessed a number of additional species moving through the grounds. It is always interesting to watch the nests fill and the new birds become acclimated. Birding checklists are available in the information rack at the gatehouse and can be used by visitors separate from the birding walks. Birders use the checklists to note the different species spotted or heard on the grounds.

MEMORIAL DAY CELEBRATION

This year we launched a special Memorial Day celebration honoring those who serve as well as all those buried here at Elmwood Cemetery. Our program was led by the tremendous musical voice of Madeleine Woodhouse and spiritual guidance of Elder Christopher Holder. A highlight of the day was the white dove release by Joan Luther of Winged Occasions. Families left with American Flags and red carnations to adorn their loved ones' grave. Look for this important event next Memorial Day.
